Fannie Walker Pace, known by her grandchildren as "Grandma Seay", was quite a folk artist who made her arts and crafts from materials commonly available to her. She would often sell her crafts (such as dolls) to create cash income. She made a pretty bonnet woven out of corn shucks. I was given the bonnet by my Aunt Evelyn, Grandma Seay's granddaughter, who



mounted it in a shadow box she built for it. On July 14th, 2011, I gave the bonnet to my daughter, Leah, Fannie's great-great-granddaughter. Here's a photo of Leah holding the bonnet and a close-up of the bonnet.
