INTRODUCTION

This little history is being compiled at the urging of aunts, uncles, and cousins descended mostly from the grandchildren and great-grandchildren of Joseph Benjamin Blake and Lillie Viola Smith. The reason it was decided to include the children of Joseph's father, Marion Alonzo Blake, is that, after contacting many of these cousins, I've found they have as great an interest in a family record as do the descendants of Joseph. Also, these are cousins that many of Joseph's descendants have close ties with.

To those of my relatives who show such love of family, I've got great news. After researching this family for 20 years, I stumbled onto another 'Blake' family researcher who has been looking up Blake kin since the mid 1960's and has spent far more time doing it than I've been capable of doing. Why it took me so long to find him, I don't know. He is Chester R. Johnson of Hurst, Texas. For more information on Mr. Johnson and his research, please read "Acknowledgements" Section B.

SECTION A

A word or two about the author.

In the twenty years I've been actively working on my family history, I've learned that records like this humble work are often widely dispersed and often end up years later in the hands of people interested in family research who can't figure out who the author is or how to get in touch with him.

My name is Ronald Eugene Vincent. I am the 3rd child of Wilburn Glenwood Vincent and Doris Virginia Warren. Doris is the 2nd child of Grover Cleveland Warren and Lela Oney Blake. Oney is the 6th child of Joseph Benjamin Blake and Lillie Viola Smith. Joseph is the first child of Marion Alonzo Blake and Harriette Emaline Merrell.

I have been interested in family history since my early childhood but took an avid interest in it when I became a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormons) in 1969. I began gathering information in earnest in 1970 when I got out of the U.S. Air Force and I have spent at least a few days each year since then working mostly on my mother's ancestry (Warren, Blake, Smith, and Farmer families). I have not neglected my father's ancestry. Most of it except for the last few generations had already been thoroughly researched by another researcher.

Please contact me if you have comments or suggestions, if you are researching any of the family lines mentioned herein, or if you have any information on anyone with the surnames of Blake, Warren, Smith, Farmer, Fulman, or Merel (Merrel, etc.) of Bibb or nearby counties. SECTION B

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

I must mention how greatful I am for the many hours my mother and father have spent with me looking in old graveyards, researching old county records, and visiting relatives, distant and not-so-distant. I also wish to mention how greatful I am to have such a sweet and supportive wife. Thanks to her, I have been able to spend many hours doing research when she really needed me at home.

This record would not be possible if it were not for the friendly nature of my Blake and Warren kin. They seem ever eager to help -- never pushy or insistent as relatives can sometimes be, and always loving. How they managed to be dispersed so widely and still never come in contact with Chester Johnson, I'll never know.

Chester Rankin Johnson has been researching the Blake family since 1966, "... and never heard from anyone that there had been a J.B. Blake family reunion." I wrote to him about our annual June get-togethers at Cahaba Valley Church. He has attended the Pratt family reunion many times (we're kin to them). They hold it on July 4th in Riverbend. The J.B. Blake reunion is on the 4th Sunday in June. Another Blake family reunion (without a doubt, the largest), the descendants of John Henry Blake, have their reunion on the 1st Sunday in August in Lowerytown at the Daniell Cemetery.

Why Mr. Johnson's research is so important to us is he has taken the family all the way back to pre-Revolutionary War times, back to the beginnings of this country. He has graciously granted me permission to use excerpts from his history. It would be unfair to include very much from his book in this brief record.

No Blake descendant seriously interested in the family should be without a copy of Mr. Johnson's book. It is titled, "The Blakes of Bibb County, Alabama 1819 - 1988". It is softbound, 176 pages with tons of references, and it is available from The Gregath Company, P.O. Box 1045, Cullman, Ala. 35056. The cost is \$35.00. Once you see a copy, you'll know what a good investment it really is. I have a copy, and there is a copy available at the Brent/Centreville Public Library.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS (continued)

Mr. Johnson uses an ingenious numbering scheme so that each person may be identified by generation and the association between individuals may be seen more easily. It is explained below.

PLEASE NOTE

EXCEPT FOR APPENDIX II, THE SPECIAL SECTION ON OUR WARREN KIN, DESCENDANTS WILL BE NUMBERED AS FOLLOWS:

If you number each of the children of a common ancestor then the 1st child would be number 1, the 2nd would be number 2, and so on. If there are more than 9 children, the 10th child would be number 'X', the 11th would be number 'A', the 12th would be number 'B', and so on. Each of the grandchildren will also have a number. The first childs children will all start with number 1. So the 1st child's 1st child (or the 1st grandchild) would be number 11 and the 1st child's 2nd child would be number 12. Please don't confuse number "11" as eleven. It is not eleven. Read it as "one one" and read "12" as "one two". It's the same as saying, "first child of first child" only we say it with numbers to save space. The 11th grandchild (11th child of 1st child) would be number 1A.

Our oldest ancestor in Bibb county is John Blake Sr. Therefore I would be the 3rd child of the 2nd child of the 6th child of the 1st child of the 2nd child of the 1st child of the 4th child of John Blake Sr. If you put that in numbers, (read it backwards) my number would be 4121623. Since all of the children of Marion Alonzo Blake would start with 412 (that's his number) we'll just use the numbers that come afterward to keep them short. That makes me number 1623.

One more thing. If you want to see how you're related to someone, just find what numbers you have in common and go from there. For example, Gary Buron Blake is number 458. Since my number is 1623, we have no numbers in common. That means our common ancestor is the oldest one in this book, or Marion Alonzo Blake. On the other hand, Mildred Leola Warren is number 161. We have the first two numbers in common "1" and "6". That means we both descend from Marion Alonzo Blake's firstborn child, Joseph Benjamin Blake and Joseph's sixth born child, Lela Oney Blake Warren.

Don't worry if all this seems confusing. You'll see what a help it is when you see how many kinfolks we have.

SECTION C

WHERE WE CAME FROM

Earliest Blakes

John Blake Sr. was the oldest member of the Blake family to come to Bibb County. He was a son of William Blake, a Revolutionary War soldier who died in Elbert County, Georgia in 1798. Blakes before Bibb County are given in Chester R. Johnson's book, "The Blakes of Bibb County 1819 - 1988". The book, "Southern Blakes" has William's ancestors back to Isle of Wight County, Virginia. Interested persons may find a copy of this book in the Birmingham Public Library. Please be advised that "Southern Blakes" may be difficult to follow and the information therein may not be proved to the satisfaction of the most discriminating researcher.

John Blake Sr.

John Blake Sr. was born March 8th, 1766 (I'm not sure where) and died December 11th, 1836 in Bibb County, Alabama. He married Martha Moon about 1789. I don't know when Martha died. John and Martha are buried in the small Blake-Thompson Cemetery in the forest about 2 miles north of Centreville and about 3/8 mile west of Alabama Highway 25. Martha's grave is not marked. John's grave was marked until vandals stole the tombstone. Fortunately, the marker was photographed by Chester Johnson before it was removed. The photo is in his book which is mentioned in Acknowledgement's, Section B. Anyone with any information which may lead to the recovery of John Blake's tombstone should contact me at the address and phone listed in Section A, "About the Author". John Blake Sr. and Martha Moon had 11 children.

Archibald Henry Blake Sr.

"Archer" Blake (as he was called) was the 4th child and the 2nd son born to John Blake Sr. He was born December 8th, 1795 in Elbert County, Georgia. He died June 9th, 1874 and is buried in the Pratt-Wallace Cemetery at Riverbend. On the 23rd day of September, 1819, he married Theodocia Pratt (through whom we're related to the Pratts). They were married in Cahawba (Bibb) County, Alabama. Archer's old Bible was photocopied by Chester Johnson. The entries are given on the following page.

John Blake

John Blake was the firstborn of Archer and Theodocia. He was born the 13th of July, 1820 in Bibb County, Alabama and died the 13th of October, 1883 in Bibb, County, Alabama. On August 22nd, 1844 in Bibb County, Alabama, he married Dicie Jane Griffin who was born April 7th, 1826 in Georgia. Dicie died July 13th, 1902 and She and John are both buried in the Pratt-Wallace Cemetery. They had 9 children.

Once again, I remind anyone interested in these descendants of John Blake Sr. to look for information on their other children and much other useful and interesting information in Chester R. Johnson's book mentioned in Section B, "Acknowledgements."

SECTION D

MARION ALONZO BLAKE AND HARRIETTE EMALINE MERRELL

Marion Alonzo Blake was born September 16. Depending on who wanted to know, the year of his birth varied from 1846 to 1850. Because of his birth year shown on two census records and a family record, it is most likely he was born in 1848. According to Alice Blake Howard (phone conversation 15 Feb 1982), Marion's birthplace was Marion, Perry County. However, on the 1850 Census he is shown as living in his father's home in Bibb County at age 2 (information from Chester Johnson's book). It is likely though that Marion lived for a time in Perry County. Marion's oldest son, Joseph Benjamin Blake, showed his birthplace as 'Perry County' in two marriage records and a baptism record. According to Joseph Benjamin Blake's Death Certificate, his father Marion's birthplace is West Blocton. This is unlikely. Marion was probably born in rural Bibb County as were most of our Blake ancestors.

Marion was too young to enter the War between the States. He was only 12. Marion was no weakling though. Although he was short and stocky, he was also a boxer. People would come around to his home and ask him to box them. Marion was red-headed. This is a characteristic of many Blakes. Perhaps the red hair and the eagarness for mischief (another of Marion's traits) indicates an Irish heritage. He is credited with tripping a lady at church with his umbrella when he was an old man.

Harriette Emaline Merrell

Marion married his first wife, Harriette Emaline Merrell, August 4th, 1867 in Perry County, Alabama. She is possibly the daughter of John Merrell and Mary Manuel of Perry County. There is a Harriette age 6 on the 1850 Census of this family. Her last name is spelled variously, "Merle, Merel, Merel, Merill" and "Merrell". I tend to favor the spelling, 'Merrell', this is the spelling used in her marriage record (Perry Cty. Marriages 1866 - 1876, #51). Harriette Emaline Merrell was born January 7, 1845 and died March 5th, 1893 in Bibb County (dates from Chester Johnson's book). According to Juliette Hicks she had dark skin, black eyes, and black hair. Harriette died of pneumonia.

MARION ALONZO BLAKE AND HARRIETTE EMALINE MERRELL (continued)

According to Alice Blake Howard (phone conversation 15 Feb 1982) Harriette Emaline Merrell was a school teacher. The order of birth and the names of all of Harriette's children has been been difficult to determine. All of my sources had different opinions as to which of Harriette's children were youngest, as well as what their names are and in what order they were born. An appeal to public records such as census records has not helped the situation much. The 1880 Census shows the children as Joseph B., James F., John H., Dicy M., and Velma T. The 1900 Census adds Richard and Rachel.

Family members give Harriette's children as Joseph Benjamin, John Henry, James, Ollie, Martha (Dicy M.?), Velma, Rachel, Richard, Janie, and possibly a child named Emma. But why is Ollie not mentioned in the census? Are Dicy and Martha the same person? Is the 10th child Emma? If she was the youngest, why don't any relatives remember her. Luckily, a record was kept by one of Harriette's children, John Henry. He gave it to his daughter, Mary Lou West, before he died.

According to Imorgene Blake West (interview 15 Apr 1981), Rachel Stewart got all of Marion Alonzo Blake's papers. Rachel is child #9. As yet, I haven't been able to track down Marion's papers. Perhaps they no longer exist.

Alice Blake Howard said Marion Blake lived at Brent when Harriette died. This agrees with Agnes Blake Peaton who said Harriette was buried around Schultz's Creek which isn't too far from Brent.

Elizabeth Matilda Sanders

The 1910 Census (Enumeration District 2, Sheet 9, Vol. 5 Bibb County) shows Marion Blake as age 60, wife, Lizzie, age 42. Length of present marriage, 13 years. Both born in Alabama.

MARION ALONZO BLAKE AND HARRIETTE EMALINE MERRELL (continued)

When Harriette died, Marion still had young children to raise. Back then more than now, the husband spent so much time working that he needed another wife soon.

Marion Alonzo Blake married Elizabeth Matilda Sanders on the 28th of June 1893 just 3 months and 23 days after Harriette died. Elizabeth was born in Alabama (according to the census mentioned above) on Aug 16th, 1866. Juliette Hicks tells me she was a large woman with long red hair. Since Elizabeth was 27 years old when she married Marion she may have been a widow. I have no record of a previous marriage or any other children. Her daughter Alice tells me Elizabeth had 10 miscarriages before giving birth to Alice. Since Elizabeth had so much trouble in childbirth, it is likely that Alice is her only child. For more on Alice, see the last section (Section Q).

Marion is listed as a wagoner on one record. He was a peddler. He would travel from house to house on horseback while Elizabeth would travel in a wagon. They sold vegetables. An interesting story is told by Marion's great-grandson also named Marion (grandson of John Henry Blake) about the horse he sold vegetables from. At the end of the War Between the States, a mounted union officer who was part of the occupation forces kicked Marion. Marion looked older than he was. Although Marion was only about 16 years old at the time, he came back that night, killed the union officer, and took his horse. It is said the horse must have been a parade horse. He would dance every time he heard music.

Elizabeth died on August 21, 1922. According to a family tradition, at her funeral Marion said, "My work on this earth is finished." It is said he then fell dead across her grave. There may be some truth to this. Marion died just two weeks later.

Imorgene Blake West, daughter of John Henry Blake, told me Marion died on September 4th, 1922 and is buried at Mt. Carmel Cemetery. According to Kirby (Cotton) Blake, Marion's second wife, Elizabeth Sanders is buried there also. One of John Henry Blake's grandchildren, also named Marion, said he was once shown Marion Blake's gravesite. He said it was down in the hollow by the road on the side of the cemetery nearest new Highway 5. The grave is not marked.

SECTION E

#1 JOSEPH BENJAMIN BLAKE

Joseph Benjamin Blake was the first person in my lineage that I did serious research on. When I realized that all my mother's aunts were getting old and would not be around forever, I decided to get from them all the information they could provide on each of their families (husband, children, etc.) and on their father and mother. Slowly a picture began to emerge. A picture of hard times and poverty, but, at the same time, a picture of a very close-knit family.

Joseph was born on September 21st, 1869 in Perry County, Alabama. He was a stocky man with light colored hair. All the grandchildren remember him as an antagonist. He was full of mischief. He could be good to them at times though. My mother remembers how he would carve little wooden dolls for the girls out of apple crates. He would carve slingshots for the boys.

The South had never fully recovered from the Civil War during reconstruction days before the depression of the early 1930's hit. Most of his life Joseph Blake was a poor share-cropper. He occasionally worked in the sawmill. At one time or another, he provided food and shelter for his wife, his 10 children, and most of their families. Because he had little, he was understandably possessive of the few things he did have. However, during the Great Depression, when his children needed a place to live to shelter themselves and their children, his was the home they went to. At times there were four families living in his small share-croppers house.

According to records of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (the Mormons), Salt Lake City, Utah, Joseph Benjamin Blake joined the church and was baptized the 3rd of April, 1897. At that time he gave his date of birth as 21 Sep 1869, his place of birth as Perry County and his mother's maiden name as Harriette Emaline. Family tradition has it that he later quit the church over the plural marriage issue (rumors were abundant back then, plural marriage had been outlawed in the church since Joseph's birth).

Discipline of children in Joseph's time was often tough. Two of Joseph's grandchildren, Tommy Vest and Johnny England, remember him this way, "Grandpa was mean to the children. he would hit the kids with a stick of stovewood of anything. He would chase the kids into the loft then tie 2 leather belts end-to-end and stand on the bed and try to hit the kids with it as they tried to run away."

Joseph Blake died on the June 7th, 1947 in Bibb County and is buried in the Cahaba Valley Church Cemetery.

Lillie Viola Smith

Joseph Blake was married three times. He had no children by his last two wives. His first wife, Lillie Viola Smith was born the 15th of April, 1875. This is the accepted birth year. According to daughter, Lillie Blake Warren who was named after her, "Lillie Viola Smith was about 18 when she married and about 57 when she died. Lillie Smith didn't know her own birth date as she was only 10 or 11 when her Mother died. Her Father died within a year or so."

Lillie Smith is said to be the daughter of Jessie Kirby Smith. This differs from data in the 1880 Census which indicates a Lilie (and a sister, Ellen) in the family of Rufus Smith, and wife Emaline ages 35 and 37 of Kingdom Beat. Jessie Smith, age 60, and Fannie, age 38, both of Six Mile, have no Lilie (Lillie, Lilly) in their family. However, they do have many other family members which Lillie Blake Warren told me were Lillie Smith's brothers and sisters (Dock, John, Mollie, etc.). Jessie Kirby Smith died, according to family tradition, from old wounds received in battle during the Civil War. Another family tradition has it that Kirby was a general. There is no evidence to support this. I have yet to find a record of his service during the war. I'm sure it will turn up sooner or later, but, there was a General Kirby Smith (not our Kirby) who fought during the war. He was a college educated man from another state. It is possible that our Kirby was aware of General Kirby Smith and was so proud they shared the same name that he made mention of it to his descendants. Tales get twisted over time and this mention of the General and Jessie Kirby Smith could have blended with age. This is only an assumption and has no historical foundation.

Lillie Viola Smith's mother

According to Doris Warren Vincent, grandaughter, Lillie Viola Smith's mother died of jaundice and was buried at night because of the swelling. The funeral could not be held off. There was no embalming back then. The unexpected deaths of Lillie Smith's mother and father within a year of each other and while the children were still young caused much hardship for the children. There were no orphanages back then. A home had to be found for each of the children. Tradition has it that they all went to different homes and some of their foster parents were not very kind to them. Some of them were made to work very hard.

Joseph Blakes marriage to Lillie Smith is recorded as follows: (from Bibb County Marriage License Records Book I Page 163) "J.B. Blake and Lillie Smith 28 Nov 1892 married at Isaac Parkens by J.T. Avery J.P."

Joseph Blake's son-in-law, Lawson Barnett, records Lillie Smith's death: (from Lawson Barnett's journal) "May the 12, 1931 Dide at 630 AM at age of 56 years".

Martha Farley Witcher

Five years after his wife, Lillie, died, Joseph married Martha Farley, the widow of a man named Witcher. From Bibb County Marriage License Records Book 1 Page 14:

Rufus did not like the name. Anyway, the name never stuck, but "Boy" did stick. He picked the name "Rufus" himself, but, since he had been called "Boy" so long, his name became "Rufus Boyd".

SECTION F

#2 MAMIE E. BLAKE

Mamie was unknown to me before I was told by Juliette Hicks that Mary Lou Blake West had the record mentioning her birth. She was born February 3rd, 1871. Except for her death date, July 14th, 1877, nothing else is known of her. She was only 6 years old when she died.

SECTION G

#3 JAMES F. BLAKE

James was born the 8th of February, 1873, the 3rd child of Marion and Harriette. He died when he was only 16 years old on December 9th, 1889. Like his sister, Mamie, nothing else is known of him.

SECTION H

#4 JOHN HENRY BLAKE

John Henry Blake was born the 1st day of February, 1874 at Primative Ridge, Al. He married Della Daniell on the 15th of January, 1899 at Lowrytown, Al. Since John Henry's 1st three children were born at Primative Ridge, I'm assuming he lived there until about 1904 when he must have moved back to Lowrytown. Imorgene told me the rest of the children were born in Lowrytown but John Henry died at Primative Ridge on December 26th, 1945. He spent his last years with his daughter, Mary Lou Blake West who lived at Primative Ridge. He worked in the coal mines at least some. His grandson, James John Blake, tells me he was once trapped by a cave-in in a mine near Blocton and had to wait until he could be dug out.

Della Daniell was born September 20, 1883 in Lowrytown, Al. She was the daughter of Soloman Daniell and Martha Jane Stewart. Della died in West Blocton, Al. on June 20th, 1925.

John and Della are buried in the Daniell Cemetery in Lowrytown where the family reunion for their descendants is held each August on the 1st Sunday. Their tombstones are inscribed as follows:

"John Henry Blake Feb. 21, 1874 to Dec. 26, 1945
Dellar Daniel Sept 20, 1883 to June 19, 1925"

Just a note on the family reunion - - It used to be held on
the 1st Sunday in September, but it was moved to the 1st
Sunday in August about 20 years ago. Marion Blake, grandson
of John and Della told me that it has only rained on the
reunion about twice in the last 30 years. Marion also told
me that the name Daniell (with two "l's" is pronounced "Dan'l"
and he thinks it may be derived from a European name pronounced
"Dan - eel" or something like that rather than the popular
but unrelated name of Daniel (with one "l"). This is in
spite of the fact that the name is sometimes spelled with only
one "l".

John and Della's children are by far the most numerous of all Marion Alonzo Blake's descendants. Listed on the following pages, they number more than 200.

Henry Wesley Blake was a coal miner. He worked at Bootheton, Black Diamond #9, and Marvel #3 from 1933 to 1952. He then moved to Brighton where he worked at Jones Manufacturing and did yard work and other odd jobs until his death.

SECTION J

#5 OLLIE D. BLAKE

Ollie's family was unknown to me until the 26th of August, 1991 when I received a call from Ruth Blake Howell. It seems a grandaughter of Ollie, Evelyn Howard, had called Ruth about the family. Ruth gave me her phone number. Evelyn has a son, Tony Ferrell, who has been working on the family history for years. Tony and I got together the next day and spent the day together. I learned all that is in this section from Tony and his family.

I had been told that Ollie died giving birth to her last child. Actually, her youngest child, Ellon, was seven months old when Ollie died of pheaumonia and measles. Her, husband, John Hill, was a farmer. He was born in Tuscaloosa County and moved with his wife back to Bibb County after the birth of their third child. They lived in or near West Blocton. The third child, Henry, was buried in an unmarked grave at Shiloh Church Cemetery.

After Ollie's death, John and the children moved back to Tuscaloosa and took jobs in the Rosenau Hosiery Mills in the Rosedale area. A year later they moved back to the Shiloh Church area. John ran a grist mill (Doss's Mill) for several years in that section of Bibb County.

John Hill is one of eleven children born to David Hill and Sarah Norwood. David was the son of William R. Hill of Georgia. For people who are interested in the Hill line, I suggest you contact Tony Ferrell who gave me this information. Tony's address in August 1991 was P.O Box 794, Tuscaloosa, AL. 35402.

John G. Hill was born the 19th of January, 1861 in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama. He died the 13th of November, 1951. John married Ollie Dicey Blake on the 28th of June, 1893 in Tuscaloosa County and is buried in the Ducanville Methodist Church Cemetery in Tuscaloosa County.

Ollie Dicey Blake was born on the 18th of February, 1877 in Bibb County, Alabama. She died the 9th of April, 1911 and is buried at Mt. Carmel Cemetery in West Blocton, Bibb County, Alabama. Her grave is located in the old section of the cemetery which is across the street from the parsonage and directly behind the church. Her grave is directly across the street from the new part and near a cedar tree.

#6 VELMA T. BLAKE

In an interview on April 15, 1981 Imorgene Blake West told me that Velma married Ben Perry and had the following children: Charlie, Earl, Carl, and M.R. She said some of this information she obtained from tombstones at the old Hill place. I have no idea where the old Hill place is. Imorgene died before I could get back with her to find out.

Juliette Hicks told me that Velma had twin boys. She didn't know of the other children. She also told me that Velma lived in Scottsville or Vernontown or some place like that. Perhaps the old Hill place is around that vicinity. Scottsville Road is near Lowrytown where the Daniell Cemetery is located.

SECTION L

#7 JANE N. BLAKE

On the 15th of April, 1981, I went with my mother and Uncle Kirby and Aunt Mennie May Blake to the Bibbville Baptist Church Cemetery where Janie and her husband Oscar Lawrence are buried. We found tombstones with the following inscriptions:

"Janie Lawrence 1879 - 1967" (daughter of Marion A. Blake)

"Oscar Lawrence 1869 - 1919" (Janie's Husband)

"Lee Roy Lawrence Jan. 22, 1897 to Aug. 15, 1966" (Janie's son)

"Fannie Lawrence Feb. 3, 1899 to Nov. 24, 1978" (Lee Roy's wife)

The relationships were given to me by Uncle Kirby Blake.

I was told by Imorgene Blake West that Lee Roy's name was James Leroy Lawrence. James John Blake told me that Hardy O. Lawrence (born 18 September, 1919 and died 30 Dec 1941) is Leroy's son.

On August 9th, 1990, Juliette Hicks told me that Janie's children were Leroy, Lonnie, Willie (a male), Clara, Robert, Jack, and Irabell. She said Irabell married a Hodges and lives in Dora, Alabama.

In a telephone conversation on February 15, 1982 Alice Blake Howard told me that Janie Blake Lawrence had a son, Robert Lawrence, phone 665-2214. I called the number but the people that answered don't know anyone named Lawrence. Perhaps he is dead now, I don't know. Juliette Hicks told me that Willie and Ira Bell are the only ones still living. Juliette said Ira Bell married a Hodges and lived in Dora, Al. and her mother, Jane, lived there with her prior to her death.

SECTION M

#8 RICHARD T. BLAKE

Richard Taylor Blake was born December 9th, 1880 in Alabama. His daughter, Juliette is not sure which county he was born in. She said it may have been Bibb County but she's not sure. He married Margie Melvina Roland, daughter of Andrew Dennis Roland and Almerina Jane Cox, on January 15th, 1904 in West Blocton, Al. and Richard died on May 22nd, 1950 in Bessemer, Al.

Margie Roland's mother, Almerina, was from a people known as Black Dutch. They look like the Dutch people but aren't as fair as them. They have a darker skin tone and dark hair and eyes. Margie was born April 13th, 1889 at Primative Ridge, Al., and died May 26, 1953 in Bessemer, Al. Richard and Margie are buried in the Hickory Hill Cemetery behind Mt. Carmel Church.

Richard Blake was a tall man who had black hair, dark colored skin and high cheekbones. He was a good Christian man with high morals. He took his children to church every Sunday. He was the Sunday School Superintendent of the 3rd Baptist Church in Primative Ridge for years. He was also a deacon of the church. It is Southern Baptist now, but, back then, it was a Missionary Baptist Church.

When Richard was a little boy, he had to work hard for the family. He and his father, Marion Alonzo Blake, would get up before dawn and work all day until after dark for 25 cents a day. Marion was a share-cropper. His family lived near Centreville.

Juliette said her father had an uncle named Richard who was a Missionary Baptist minister. This older Richard had long white whiskers. She only saw him once when he came by her father's home in a wagon and her father went out and stopped him to talk. This, no doubt, is Richard Hobson Blake who was Marion Alonzo Blake's brother. Juliette remembers him and two of Marion Blake's sisters, namely Theodocia Blake, and Amanda Jane Blake (known as Aunt Jeanie).

SECTION N

#9 RACHEL D. BLAKE

According to the family record in possession of Mary Lou Blake West, Rachel was born June 26, 1884. This agrees with the 1900 census (except for the month). That would make her 9 years old if her mother died in 1893. Juliette Hicks said her father, Richard was 6 and Rachel was 4 when their mother died. Alice Howard said Harriette's youngest child was 6 when Harriette died. Since several written sources (family records and census records) agree with the years of birth for both Richard and Rachel, and the family record of Harriette's death agree's with Chester Johnson's book, I must assume that Richard and Rachel were older than 6 and 4 when their mother died.

According to Lillie Blake Warren in an interview 1972, Rachel married Clint Stewart. In August, 1990 Juliette Hicks told me Rachel had the following children that she could remember: Clarence, Ora Mae, Lavera, and R.F. Juliette said R.F. died at Bryce's Mental Hospital in Tuscaloosa. He had no children. Lavera had two daughters. They're buried at Hickory Hill Cemetery. Juliette doesn't recall their names.

In 1982 Alice Blake Howard said Ora Mae married J.B. Kornagay. I called J.B. in June 1990. J.B. told me Ora Mae died in 1967.

SECTION P

#X BESSIE E. BLAKE

The following is excerpted from the family record in possession of Mary Lou Blake:

Bessie E. Blake [born] Sept. 27 1886 Bessie E. Blake [died] Sept.29 1891.

Imorgene Blake West told me that she thought Harriette Emaline Merrell's 10th child was named Emma or something like that. Perhaps Bessie middle initial "E" stood for "Emma". Since Bessie only lived to age 5, its understandable that those living 80 years later would have difficulty remembering her. It is not known where Bessie is buried. However, a copy of Marion Blake's marriage to Lizzie Sanders shows they were married at Primative Ridge in 1893 just two years after Bessie's death. Residents in the area told me that members of the 3rd Baptist Church bury their dead at Mt. Carmel. Bessie's grave may be in there.

SECTION Q

#A ALICE W. BLAKE

Alice W. Blake is the only daughter I have record of born to Marion Alonzo Blake and Elizabeth Sanders. Alice was born in 1908. She married Clarence S. Howard and they had one son, Samuel Eugene Howard. Samuel has one child, a daughter, Hilary. Samuel and his wife live in Mountain Brook. They are professional concert pianists. Alice babysits and keeps house for them while they are on tour.

APPENDIX I

BIBB COUNTY DURING THE GREAT DEPRESSION

(An Autobiography of Doris Warren Vincent)

I have included this biographical sketch for two reasons. First and foremost, it is very dear to me and I want to leave it for posterity. But, secondly, I feel it will touch the hearts and memories of Blakes and Blake descendants of my mother's generation who grew up in Bibb County during the Depression years of 1930 to 1940. My mother, Doris Warren Vincent, was 5 years old when the stock market crashed in 1929. I want the people of my generation to have at least one record of what things were like back then and I want the people of the next generation to know that it is possible to get by with very little and still be happy.

I will not indent or use quotes (to save space). What follows beginning with the next paragraph is a copy of my mother's history as she wrote it out in longhand.

January 1, 1979

I was just remembering my childhood today & something came to mind that still means a lot to me today. Since I grew up during a rough time for the whole country, I got to thinking why so many things mean so much to me. The Market Crash and the Great Depression of 1929 meant nothing to us because we had nothing before, so it didn't matter too much we had nothing afterward. It was an uphill climb all the way. Nobody we knew had any more than we did. Now, I figure this is why I cherish everything I own, especially my home and family, my whole family, aunts, uncles, cousins & all.

I was five years old in 1929. That was the year I had typhoid & spent my first night (two weeks) in a hospital, saw my first fire engine & saw Birmingham, Ala. for the first time (from my hospital room window). Of course, I didn't know where I was till my fever broke and I started recovery. I don't remember much except for the last week, cause I also had chicken pox while I was there. I loved my nurses & they must have loved me because when I left, one gave me her manicure scissors, one gave me the saucer and bowl I ate mashed potatoes and ice cream out of , all of which I still have 50 years later.

The earliest I can remember, I must have been about 3 years old. We lived somewhere near Briarfield & Montevallo. My paternal grandmother died & is buried at Cahaba Valley (Carlton Hill at the time), Cemetery, the road going to the church was under water & we had to go in a wagon. The hearse couldn't get thru so they put the casket in a wagon to get there. Aunt Lillie Warren verifies this. Somewhere between that time & the time I was four, I remember walking at nite with my sister and parents thru the woods & fields to my Aunt Lucille Warren Lucas' house. I got so tired & my daddy would not carry me!

I don't know how long we stayed with them or why. My daddy must have been out of work. I was running thru some plowed ground while there & ran into an old rusty plow blade which was buried. The point hit my right foot an top & down I went. It cut a bad gash across a vein & bled & bled. My mother and Aunt Lucille bathed my foot & soaked it in kerosine & bandaged it with a piece of clean white cloth. While we were there, my cousin Rosie Lucas struck a match & blew it out & stuck it to my arm, just to see if it would burn. It did & I still have the scar to prove it!

I remember my mother and Aunt Lucille slicing apples and laying them out to dry on a sheet spread over some boards or wire. They turned all of them over every few days.

I have no idea where we went from there but I believe my daddy got a job in a mine because we moved into a house of own -- rented of course. We must have moved to Piper or Coleanor or Marvel. Maybe he went to work in a sawmill because I remember my sister started to school. And I know we lived near a sawmill when she started to school. We had no furniture except a mattress, a table & chairs. My mother cooked on a fireplace. We had flapjacks & potatoes & beans. All our belongings were packed in boxes & a trunk.

We played in a sawdust pile near our house. After that I know we moved near a mine because my memory is sharper as I get near school age. I know we lived at Marvel near a company owned store.

One day my mother went to the store to get something to go with our supper & left me with my sister. I cried to go. After mama left, my sister called me in from play & put a freshly ironed dress on me (over dirt & all) & told me to go after mama. She was embarrassed to have me there in my clean dress over all that dirt but she bought me an ice cream cone. I took one big lick & the cream hit the floor & I was left with an empty cone. The storekeeper felt sorry for me & gave me another one. I was so happy!

We also saw our first movie while living in Marvel -- a silent film of course. The year was 1928 probably. We had electric lights, too. First we'd ever had or probably seen. A drop cord bulb in the middle of each room, with a pull chain to turn it on & off.

I remember so well my mother rocking me to sleep singing, "My Baby, I want you tonite, Dear, after my work is thru. To rock you to sleep in my arms, Dear & sing lullaby to you."

While we lived at Marvel, I was playing on the porch rail & tumbled overboard & landed on my head & back on our rocky yard. When I came to, Dr. H.C. Cochran was examining me & telling my parents I would probably be alright but I might have some kidney damage. Well, I did - which is another story. Or rather, kidney trouble is what he said.

My grandparents lived near Cahaba River most of the time I can remember. At one time it seems over half their ten children and their offspring lived with them. My Uncle Son (J.M. Blake) & his wife lived with them. So did Aunt Pearl, who was a widow with three sons, my mother (Oney Blake) & her two girls, Aunt Lorene & uncle Cotton (Kirby) who weren't married yet. My mother & daddy were separated at the time. All this before my sister started school. I remember living with my grandparents at least three different times. Once at Six Mile, once at Bulldog Bend on the Fancher Farm & once near there, maybe on the same farm, different house. Two places stand out in my mind, both near the river. Of course, the most vivid is when I "drowned", about 2 miles below Bulldog Bend, according to my uncles, Cotton & Son. We had all gone swimming & I was in about 2 ft. deep water when I went to the bottom. My cousin Jack England, Aunt Pearl's son, stumbled over me, & picked me up.

I must have been all of 2 1/2 to 3 yrs. old. It scared me so bad, 'til I still have a fear of Cahaba River, yet I love that part of Alabama because it also brings back some happy memories.

Once, when we lived near the river, my daddy acquired a Model T Ford. We were on our way home one night when the lights went out just as we got on the bridge to cross the river. This time it had rained very hard & the water was up near the bridge, which was being repaired. It had no side rails on it! the repairmen had placed 2 by 4 boards along the sides near the edges. My daddy had a carbide miner's lamp & he lit it & got out & looked. Our front tire was over one of the 2 by 4's already. We were scared stiff. Mama had to hold the lamp & walk backwards across the bridge 'til daddy could inch his way across without going overboard. The wind kept blowing out the lamp, they had to stop & relite every few minutes. I'm sure we all gave a prayer of thanks once we got across. Today that bridge has been replaced but part of the old one is still there. It's to the left of the first one crossing the river going from West Blocton toward Centreville.

After talking with my Aunt Pearl last week, we decided that my family had to live at Helena or Coleanor when I had typhoid because Aunt Pearl had it the same year. She says there were five members of the family besides me who were sick with fever at the same time, my grandparents & 2 aunts & an uncle. I have no idea how they contracted it but the County Health Dept. decided they would condemn a spring from which we had been getting our drinking water. I also have no idea how my parents & sister avoided it, if that's where I got it.

After my stay in the hospital, I had to learn to walk again, which took about a week or 10 days. All my hair came out & came back a different color & not nearly as curly.

We had to get water from a neighbor's well, which was tested & declared safe. Just a short while later we moved to somewhere else.

As I mentioned in the beginning we had little to eat, very few clothes, or belongings. I do know that none of the children in my family seemed to realize how little we had. We treasured all that we owned, especially an old cedar pencil with no eraser & a rough, first grade tablet. If the pencil HAD to be sharpened we would get our parents to do it with a very sharp knife so as little as possible would be cut away.

We were always happy & played hide & seek, climbing trees, whittling wood - if we could get hold of a knife, or we played school & church & sang. We had to amuse ourselves because we had no toys & our parents had no time to help us stay busy. We stayed out of trouble too. We knew all too well if we didn't we'd have stripes on our legs for everyone to see. We didn't get a spanking or a beating, we got a switching we didn't forget. Doing anything really bad just never occurred to us. If it did, we knew to put it out of our minds.

We were absolutely delighted to find an old innertube. That meant we could make slingshots. We didn't shoot each other, we shot to see who could get a rock or gravel as far from where we were standing as possible. The one who won just won & that was it, just plain old competition. We also played with bottles like castor oil or medicine bottles. They had to be flatsided because we laid them on the side & used them for cars. Our people inside them were little sticks or match sticks - already burned.

When hickorynuts fell the whole family would go into the woods & hunt hickorynuts. That was fun. We would crack them on the hearth at nite & pick the meat out with horseshoe nails & eat 'til we got tired of them.

On rainy days we would all huddle up in a bunch & get our grandpa to tell us stories. He also whittled dolls out of apple crate wood occasionally. My sister has one he made for her. It's shaped like a gingerbread man or woman.

June 22, 1980

Today was homecoming day at Cahaba Valley Church in Bibb County. We always have a good time visiting with aunts & uncles & cousins and eating all that good food. Everyone wants pictures of everyone else. this year was a lot sadder than usual because we had two of our precious members missing. Two of my mother's sisters died within the past fourteen months, one just five weeks ago. My oldest living aunt, Pearl who was 84, died in May. the year before our youngest aunt, Lorene had died. She was 66.

Thinking on this got me started looking in the Church Cemetery for markers on graves. On my father's side I have two cousins, an aunt & uncle & both grandparents. the uncle is my grandfather's brother, Byrd Warren & his wife. One of the cousins is Thomas Warren, who was a soldier in the Civil

War. The other cousin's grave is unmarked. My grandparents are LaFayette and Frances Farmer Warren. These graves are near the Church at the back. They have markers.

Across the small road in front of the Church are the Blakes, including my mother, her mother & father, my mother's sisters, Myrtie Bell Blake Barnett, and Lorene Blake Parks.

There is another cemetery at West Blocton, also in Bibb County where more relatives are buried. My Uncle Earnest Blake and his wife Ilar, and my Aunt Pearl Blake and her second husband, Early Miller are buried there. This one is named Mt. Carmel & Hickory Hill Cemeteries next to one another.

My parents and another family, a cousin I think, went fishing on the Cahaba River one nite & we all slept on quilts on the ground. We were afraid of the nite sounds so they kept a fire going all nite. The next morning we had fresh fish from the river and flapjacks for breakfast -- Umm -- best fish in the world! All cooked on our campfire.

We had taken our little black & white dog with us & he had jumped out of the car & disappeared just as we neared the river. We never saw him again. My sister and I were so sad about losing him. We kept hoping we would wake up & find him the next morning but he didn't come back.

I believe we left that part of Bibb County about 1930 or 1931 because we moved to Brent, Ala. & lived there for nearly a whole summer.

Let me go back to my first year in school, which was at Bull Dog Bend. The school was a one room building - a former church. We had one teacher for 6 or 7 grades of pupils. Her name was Miss Narramore, & we loved her. Even tho she spanked my hand with a ruler for accepting a note from my first sweatheart, name of Wilburn Parks (a cousin of my Uncle Oliver Parks, who was to marry my Aunt Lorene). Oh, he got a spanking too.

We had a Christmas party at school, where every child received a gift. Who bought those gifts, I don't know. On Valentines Day our teacher gave us beautiful Valentines. We enjoyed every day of school because it was somewhere to go & we were learning how to read & write & do arithmetic. The winter must have surely been hard on us because we had to walk to school but I don't remember much about the weather.

Our school had a big pot belly heater which burned wood. The older boys had to bring the wood in & the teacher kept the fire going. this was the year my mother & daddy were separated most of the year because I don't remember seeing my daddy the whole winter.

The latter part of April or the first of May my daddy came to the school & got my sister & me & told us we were going to pick up mama, that they were getting back together. Of course, we believed him (what child wants to believe their daddy or mama would lie to them? After all, weren't they the ones who taught us not to lie?). He took us to his sister's house near Montevallo. We didn't mind, but after a few days & our mama didn't come we realized she wasn't coming at all. He had literally kidnapped us!

We did not get to finish school that year. I know now we weren't there long but it seemed like a year because so much happened while we were there. Our maternal grandmother died. My mother's sister, Lillie, who was married to my daddy's brother, Sam, came to take us to the funeral. My daddy's sister, Genie Warren Hughes, would not let us go with her. She was afraid my mother would get us, (and she fully intended to) & she would lose her "little girls", as she called us. My sister and I cried because we wanted to go. We wanted to see our mama so bad. After that, if she let us go to the highway to get the mail we would sit by the mailbox & wish our mama would come by & get us.

This is a tale of something which happened to me there, unbelievable but so true. Remember, I was 6 yrs. old & my sister was 8. My aunt & uncle made us work, my sister helped with the housework & I helped my uncle feed the animals. He worked for a man who ran a dairy farm. I went with him every evening to feed. I honestly don't remember actually seeing him take feed for his own hog, but I'm sure he bought no feed. The dairyman, a Mr. Holloway, called him before him one day & told him he was missing feed or that he was feeding too much at one feeding. I suggested (remember I was 6 yrs. old) the animals opened the door to the feedroom themselves. I was to regret opening my mouth later. My uncle, took me back to the house, got my sister & my aunt & a rope & we went walking into the woods. He tied my feet with the rope & hung me by my heels from a tree limb. He told me he was going to leave me there 'til the buzzards came & picked my eyes out. I have no idea how long I hung there but they walked off & left me. I'm sure my sister was wishing she could kill both my uncle & aunt. they finally took me down & told me to keep my mouth shut from then on. Would you believe I wouldn't try to mind anyone else's

business to this day. But, if I see someone taking something that doesn't belong to them, I will if possible, report them to the proper authorities.

My daddy finally came & got us & tried to get back together with my mother. We never visited that particular aunt & uncle again to my knowledge. The Uncle's name was Dutch Hughes. I never liked him very much because he always called me PugUgly. We were so happy to get away from their house. My aunt had us wash dishes and every time one got broken we got a spanking, or rather, a switching. I find it hard to punish a child for breaking dishes or glasses to this day. The one thing we learned from that was if you aren't careful with them they will break. Everybody breaks them sometimes.

Remember, all these times we lived with our different relatives, my mama & daddy were always separated. Still, I don't remember ever hearing them fuss at each other or fight at all. If they did, it was out of earshot to my sister and me. I believe most of the time we were left with relatives, my daddy was looking for a job. Where he stayed, I never knew.

We lived for a time, perhaps a couple of months with my daddy's brother, Sam, but he was always with us there. He helped my uncle work in the fields. Once, we had an old Model T truck and my daddy brought vegetables to Birmingham and peddled them from the truck bed. I came with him once and I'm sure he parked at Owen's Station along Third Ave. which is now known as Bessemer Road or Hiway 11.

There is one particular spot where Arkadelphia Road crosses 3rd Ave. West that I remember. It was vivid in my memory because the buildings were only torn down a few years ago. I remember every one of them, a grocery store, a drug store, & a barber shop. Later, the grocery was used as an apartment and my own sister-in-law, Celia Vincent Bass, lived in it. It was attached to a two-story house. That road was the main road coming into Birmingham from the northern end of Bibb County toward Bessemer. Still is, except for the freeway which by-passes it.

The truck bed had stake sides that held up a piece of old muslin sheet, or maybe feed sack sheet, which kept the sun off the vegetables. We had moved from Brent, Ala. in that truck & probably moved to Irondale in it later. We moved there in June or July of 1932. Again, we moved in with relatives. This time with my mother's sister, Aunt Lucille Vest (later Davis). My Uncle Ed had a job in a mine & he helped my daddy get one there, too.

Later on we moved into a house by ourselves which we liked. This was one of 6 houses in a cluster on the corner of 20th St. in Irondale, all owned by the same family. We lived in 4 of them at various times, with & without relatives. The first was a three room apartment in a house which had about 6 rooms. Since nobody owned that much furniture we rented part of a house. Another couple with one son rented the rest of the house. The rent was never more than 2 or 3 dollars a month. If we lived with relatives we each paid half the rent. Remember, this was 1930, the worst part of the Depression.

One man, who owned a mine my uncle & daddy worked for didn't pay money at all. He paid in flour, meal, lard, salt, coffee & beans & sugar. Fifty cents a day was good pay. The staples were weighed & measured & the amount received was judged by how much coal you had dug or how hard you worked that week. Anyone fortunate enough to have garden tools & seeds & a place to plant them had more food. The only tools I can remember us having were a hammer, an ax, a pair of pliers and a shoe last. The shoe last was for keeping the shoes fixed & for cracking hickory nuts on, in the winter time. The ax was for cutting wood & fingers & toes & the hammer was for pulling nails out of one thing & putting them in another. The only nails bought were shoe tacks .Of course, the hammer was used for cracking nuts on the shoe last.

Remembering teachers.

I remember all of my teachers because many of them had been with the school I went to since their beginning & many also lived in the same community. Teachers are numbered grades 2 thru 9, 1931 thru 1940.

First grade was Miss Narramore whom I loved dearly, even if she did spank me & Wilburn Parks for my acceptance of a "love" note from him! She also made me stand & read it to the classroom. No, we didn't get taken to the cloak room, we got the palms of hands spanked in front of the whole school which went through the 6th or 7th grade -- all in one room -- all the same teacher. We learned right quick we were there to study, & learn to read & write & do arithmetic. I doubt she had over 25 or 30 kids, if that many.

Second grade was Miss Margaret Pope who married in the summer & became Mrs. Naff. To me she was beautiful. She took up a lot of time with me & made me feel like "somebody". She got the room mothers to buy me a new dress which I treasured very much. It may have been the first "bought" dress I ever had because mama made all of our dresses & slips & panties. I cried the first time it got dirty 'cause I knew I had to wait a whole day for it to be washed & ironed.

In the third grade I had Miss Booth who was in love with our school principle, Mr. Millsap, whom she married in the summer. She was a pretty woman, with very black hair which was long & she wore it in a bun at the back of her neck. All during the school term, Mr. Millsap would come by our classroom door & look in several times a day. In a few minutes she would go out in the hall & they would talk & she would come back in all smiling & happy. It took us a while to catch on but we were happy too, when we found out they were going to be married. Then, that summer they had their wedding in one of our community churches.

The fourth grade brought Mrs. Esther Turnham. She was a close friend of Miss Booth, now Mrs. Millsap. She really believed in writing legibly & neatly. We had writing classes & she was very strict. We had tests & were graded just like for math or any subject. If we wrote sloppily on any test paper we got points off, also on homework. I made A's & B's but you'd never know it now. She probably wouldn't admit to being my teacher. In mid-year one day she was called out of the room by another teacher & she came back in crying & dismissed us for the day. Our beloved principle had committed suicide. We found out later that he had cancer & couldn't face life because there was absolutely no cure then. This was 1934. He had shot himself in the head at his & his bride of about 4 months, home, just a half block from the school. We didn't go back to school until after the funeral. His wife quit teaching & left Irondale shortly after & we never heard from her again.

The fifth grade brought us Miss Tillie Wood. She was old & taught different from any teacher in school. She was tiny & wore glasses & wore her black hair in long Shirley Temple curls as long as anyone can remember. She was the first teacher there after the cornerstone was laid & as far as I know never taught any where else. Every morning she had prayers to begin the day & a Bible reading & then a story from Peter Rabbit. Oh, we looked forward to that because it was always continued. She was easy going, never scolding very much & we all loved her, as did every one she taught. The fifth & sixth grades were joined by a partition which could be raised which turned them into the auditorium. In front of our room was the stage & the piano used for plays & choir practice was in our room. We got to listen in on a lot of things the rest of the school didn't.

When I reached the sixth grade I had a teacher who was very strict on everybody & none of the kids liked her. I started making bad grades in math & never did catch up again. All my other subjects were not as hard to learn as math. I believe all the kids were so glad when that year was over that we shouted. By the way, the teacher's name was Mrs. Macon.

The seventh grade was just heaven compared to sixth. Everyone loved Mrs. McClendon. She was another teacher who had been at the school since the year One. She was very sympathetic & understanding about all our problems. I once showed her a patch of poison oak on my arm, which I had gotten on a field trip, & she brought medicine from home & gave it to me to heal my arm. Since we were in junior high we didn't mind leaving our homeroom teachers we loved because they taught us from grades 7 thru 9. Mrs. "Mac" taught English & history. Miss Margaret Haynes taught P.E. & health. Mrs. Rayfield taught Home Economics & spelling. Mr. Hammond came as our homeroom 9th grade teacher & he took over history class & math. Miss Haynes had us for a half year as 8th grade homeroom & then Mrs. Rayfield came, so Miss Haynes took over science & health & they worked together as P.E. teachers.

When I mentioned field trips, I meant hiking & walking thru the woods, around dirt roads wherever we went. Not enough folks owned cars, nor made enough money in those years to charter a bus or drive us anywhere. we visited a sand pit a few miles from school. We walked thru woods identifying trees & flowers as we went, & making notes as we walked. One year we did get enought parents to take the home Ec. class to a popular swimming place on Cahaba River nearby. We spent the nite, & did our own cooking & went swimming & had a great time.

We also had a girls choir which got to go sing at other schools for special programs, & we got to sing on two radio stations, W.A.P.I. & W.S.G.N. This was the highlight of the whole year. We thought we were absolutely beautiful in our navy blue skirts & white blouses. We only had one music teacher throughout our junior years, Mrs. Irene Ziegler Hill who also lived to teach my own children in the nineteen fifties.

Mar. 9, 1982

Now, I'll go back to our first years in Irondale. As I said we moved in with my Aunt Lucille & Uncle Ed Vest. Her son James is about 2 or 3 yrs. my junior but we played together good for several years. We all had to move so we

got the 2 room apt. I mentioned earlier, on the southeast corner of 20th St. in Irondale. They moved to East Irondale with my uncle's parents. This was before school started in the fall of 1930, or maybe '31. Anyway, my daddy had a job at the time. The house we lived in needed a roof sa bad 'til when it rained we had to use all of our 2 or 3 pots & pans, dishpan, washpan, washtubs, water buckets & still move the bed to the driest part of the room & even then it would get wet sometimes! But we liked living there because we were a family again & we had something to eat & good neighbors. Besides, one of our neighbors had a cow & we could get milk & butter when we had the money. Milk was about 20 cents a gallon & butter about 15 cents a half pound cake. Of course, that was a very rare treat because nobody had 20 cents or even 1 cent most of the time. We ate a lot of rice, and or, bread & thick gravy.

I just don't know about prices much the first year or two, but later on I remember that a dollar would buy quite a few groceries. My gosh, if somebody had a 2 dollar bill they were rich!

The house we were living in was coming apart. The walls & ceilings were falling in. They were plastered & painted & the leaky roof didn't help. After we moved out it was condemned & torn down. We moved across the street to another house owned by the same family. A whole house for \$3.00 a month! That was a dollar per room but we only used two & couldn't fill them up. We had a bed & a trunk in the bedroom & a table & chairs(4) & stove in the kitchen.

Now this stove was something else. It was a gasoline stove. A tank held gas & there was a pump that had to be pumped up like pumping a tire before it could be lit. And you had to be very careful because it would blow up! It did once & caught my daddy on fire. We were scared half to death. Mama got the fire out by beating it with her hands & a towel & trying to get his shirt off without tearing it. He probably only had two shirts to his name, one to work in & one to put on at home. From that time on, mama would not let us in the kitchen when the stove was being lit. All the food cooked on it had a taste of gasoline. The only thing that didn't seem to pick it up was beans, maybe because they cooked with a lid & were always steaming up away from the fumes.

This was the house where my daddy was keeping some white mice for a man who raised them for the government. Mama hated them. They were just rats to her, but I enjoyed playing with them, when she wasn't looking. We moved from

this house to the one next door. My Aunt Lucille & her family moved into this one. While we lived there her daughter Betty came down with diphtheria & then we were all quarantined. That meant nobody could come in or go out of our yard or houses. She nearly died but they finally got someone to take her to the hospital & they saved her. I remember her brother James praying for God to not let his baby sister die. Later on I wondered how anybody as mean as he was could get God to do anything. We were left to look after him while his parents were at the hospital with Betty. He would not mind my mama no matter what. My sister & I held him down so mama could switch him but he still didn't mind unless the notion struck him! He was forever doing things to make my sister & me mad at him.

My daddy finally left us again & was gone a very long time. We moved again to a house behind & down the street from this one, along with Aunt Lucille & her family. This house we stayed in from 1932 til I had married & moved away & my mama & sister stayed until mama died in 1942. It had 3 rooms and a large hall which we took for storage along with our one room and my aunt & uncle had 2 rms. including the kitchen. We set up a pot bellied iron stove on the outside wall & put the pipe thru the top part of the window. In this room we had a bed, an easy chair & dresser (the latter 2 pcs. compliments of Welfare) a table & four chairs & a little table for storage of food, which didn't hold much but there wasn't much available, not to us anyway. It also held all the pots & pans & dishes & silverware.

Mama was & had been for quite some time taking care of washing & ironing & scrubbing for anyone who could afford to pay her, with money or food. She also had a half day work on Sat. for a bookbinder in Birmingham. We were able to buy flour, meal, lard, white meat & eggs. Eggs were only 10 cents a dozen. Also beans which we had quite often, & peas. Since there were only three of us we could get by 4 days on a dozen eggs.

For a long time we bought a half gallon of butter-milk & bread for supper every nite. Since mama was earning a few dollars we were able to buy dress material. She sewed all our clothes by hand. Our slips & panties were made from flour sacks.

My aunt & uncle finally moved out in 1932 or '33 & went to Kentucky for a year. He got a mining job there. We were so happy to have the whole house again! My daddy showed up again in 1933 but he didn't stay long, maybe just a day or two. Anyway, it was spring & he wanted mama to go with him

to run a motel. She would be the cleaning woman & we would live in one of the cabins. Now, back then a motel was NOT used exclusively for travelers. It was used mostly for hanky-panky & the operator was not supposed to notice who came & went at what hours. Of course, my mama would have no part in trying to raise two girls in a place like that, much less work at one. So daddy bade us goodbye & we watched him out of sight, walking down the railroad in front of our house, toward Birmingham. We figured he'd catch the next freight that came by. He must have because four years later came a letter from my Aunt Lillie (married to daddy's brother, Sam) saying he had died in Kentucky in March 1937.

April 1983

Back at the house that had the plaster falling and the leaky roof, we had a little puppy. As I said we ate a lot of rice so the dog did too. The little thing got rice stuck on his paws & it dried & he walked thru the house sounding like he had on tap shoes. There was a boy next door whom I really liked. His parents had a cow & that's where we bought buttermilk & butter when we could afford it. He gave me my first Valentine from a friend. He had his daddy come over with him & slipped it under our kitchen door. Then he went back home & his daddy got my daddy to the door & told him to get me to come & look what I had under the door!

I started to school while we lived there & we walked to school together. I didn't like him very long though. I had a new store bought dress, that the teacher & one of the mother's had given me. I loved it. My other dress was homemade. On our way home one day, I had lost a "cracker jack" ring & this boy found it & wouldn't give it back. We got in a scuffle & I jerked my hand back and poked myself in the nostril with my pencil. Blood went all over my new dress. I was so heartbroken I never liked that boy afterward.

At the house we moved to, the one where daddy had the rats, our daddy left us again. Now, since we had been in the County of Jefferson long enough to qualify my mother filed a claim for welfare aid. It was no easy thing to get. The social worker couldn't seem to understand why we couldn't go back to Bibb County to my grandpa's house, or to some other relative. She couldn't believe that none of our relatives were financially able to support their own family, much less take on three more. In the meantime we were surviving literally on handouts & leftovers from the neighbors. A dear friend, who had a mean non-compassionate husband who actually had a job just cooked a little extra & went out to

"feed" his dog after meals & brought it to us instead. Oh, we had rice, don't ask me where we got it but it was always there. The gas stove, which we were afraid of, and had to "charge" a nickel's worth of gas for, was rarely lit. I'm sure the poor gas station owner died with us owing him at least a couple of dollars 'cause we never saw money. Someone came to visit us once and brought a very small jar of mayonaise and box of crackers & sister & I ate every bite of it in one sitting. It was manna from heaven to us. Somehow we survived.

Our daddy came back & we moved into the house next door. We did not stay in this one but a short while until we moved into the one with my Aunt Lucille. The one we stayed in the longest. We had finally gotten Welfare Aid, food, or rather a slip of paper worth so much on food at a store. My mother had started washing, ironing & cleaning for a family who had a wage earner in the house! We had biscuits & white meat for breakfast & beans & bread for supper. We bought eggs, too, which we all loved, & potatoes & every now & then sausage. We ate more blackeye peas & potatoes & cornbread for supper than anything else, & more biscuits & thick gravy & white meat for breakfast. Since my mama liked greens we had them & cabbage every chance we got to find some. The foods we got from Welfare were grapefruits & juice, powdered milk & canned beef. None of it was good but it was food. We used a lot of sugar in the grapefruit juice. We even managed to buy a nickel's worth of bulk peanut butter from the meat market. That's what we took to school for lunch. When our school got a new lunchroom with a steam table we got a lunch ticket thru Welfare. For a dime we got a plate lunch & a half pint of milk. By this time mama was working for two families & at the bookbinding place. We could buy shoes & thread, & good soap to wash our face with instead of Octagon. We could afford shampoo & deodorant & face cream. We also had rayon slips & panties. Mama could buy hose that looked nice & silky.

Sunday June 10, 1984

In 15 minutes my precious sister will have been dead exactly one week. That is just one thing I never came to grips with. I still hope some one will wake me & say it isn't so. Even tho I held her hand as she died (as we did together when our precious mother died) it is just unbelievable. She talked many times to me lately about dying. She knew she was going & she felt that it would be best for her family. She would call me on the phone & tell me nobody loved her anymore & she wouldn't be missed. I can't even remember the last time we talked but it was only a few days before her death. I never dreamed she was so sick. I knew she had many physical problems but she refused to go to the doctor. The last time I saw her I told her to please go for my sake because there were only two of us.

Since our mama died we had stayed very close & in touch with each other. Sister talked a lot about mama recently. How she wished she had talked with her about different things. She also talked about Aunt Pearl & Aunt Lorene. She gave her testimony to me & to her daughter Judy & to a cousin (Betty Vest King). I'm sure she talked to others about it, too.

We shared so much in our lifetime it's hard to pinpoint any one thing. She figure's all through the little book I've been writing since Jan. 1979, because what was my life was also hers.

I think she felt so lost after mama died. After all, I was married & had a baby. She felt that we didn't want to be bothered with living with us. She did stay until she found a job & then got herself an apartment. Neither of us realized how much we depended on mama just being there. She was in the hospital from Thurs. to Sun P.M. & sister was in from Sat. A.M. til Sun. A.M.

Sister thought it was wonderful because my children & grandchildren all get together 2 or 3 times a year. She'd managed to call & talk to at least 2 of us at those times.

I loved her so much & told her so, many times. I'll miss her call & telling me her troubles & her cheerful little "Hi" when she felt good.

APPENDIX II

OUR WARREN ANCESTORS

The Warren family figures heavily in the descendants of Joseph Benjamin Blake. Two of his daughters, Lillie Mae, and Oney Lela married two brothers, Sam and Grover Warren. Their descendants are given in detail in Section E (see the index for specific individuals). Grover was my grandfather. Since he and his wife died before I was born, I was closest to my Uncle Sam and Aunt Lillie.

In the year 1970 when I was just getting out of the Air Force I was most interested in getting started on some serious family research but things like raising kids and earning a living kept getting in the way. I got an opportunity back then to talk to my Uncle Sam Warren about his family but I was inexperienced and didn't know the right questions to ask or the right information to record. Uncle Sam died that year. When my mother and I went back to visit Aunt Lillie she told me I should have asked Sam about the Warren family. She said she was getting old and had trouble remembering all the particulars about the family. As near as she could remember, and not much of this information has been verified, she said Sam Warren's grandfather was named Rubin. The name of Rubin's wife is unknown. She also told me she thought Sam Warren's father, Lafayette Warren, was born in Cedartown, Georgia. On the 1910 census, Lafayette stated that both his parents were born in Alabama and that he was also. Census records are notoriously inaccurate on such accounts, but I have reason to believe they were all from Alabama.

Three of Rubin's children are buried at Cahaba Valley Cemetery. They are: Lafayette (Sam Warren's father who will be discussed later), and the twins Virginia Byrd Burton Warren (a male) and Eugenia Warren (a female) born 16 Dec 1860. Burton died 6 Jun 1918 according to his tombstone. No death date is mentioned for Eugenia.

Aunt Lillie told me she believed Rubin's other children may have been Tom, Floyd, and Jane. She wasn't sure and neither am I. I haven't come across much on the family. There is, however, a most interesting tombstone at Cahaba Valley for one Thomas Warren (possibly our "Tom" above). It says simply, "Co. B, 30th Ala. Inf. C.S.A." I haven't researched this out for possible connecting Civil War records, but most Civil War records are severely lacking in any useful family information.

APPENDIX II

OUR WARREN ANCESTORS (continued)

According to family bibles Lafayette married Frances Elizabeth Farmer about 1889 (I'm told in Bibb County). The 1910 census shows that their marriage occured in 1892. This is an error. Frances had 7 brothers and sisters. Some of their names are known. Pearl Blake McCloud told me their order of birth was John, Walter, Frances, Addie, and four younger sisters. Three of these sisters were widows and lived in Louisiana. John was from Chilton County and had sons named Fred and Claude. Some of this information came from Sam Warren before his death in 1970. I'm sorry, but I didn't keep accurate records back then and I don't know how much information I got from him on his mother's family and how much I got from Aunt Pearl.

Frances was born April 7th, 1865 in Prattville, Alabama. She died June 22, 1928 and is buried at Cahaba Valley with her husband. Lafayette died March 4th, 1928. For those of us who wonder where he got his non-traditional name the following story may shed light on the subject. It seems that the great French General and Revolutionary War hero the Marquis de Lafayette made a trip through Alabama late in life. Many thousands of dollars were spent making his trip through the state an event not soon to be forgotten. Parades were held wherever he went and babies were named after him. This reinforces the likelyhood that Lafayette was born in Alabama rather than Georgia. His family is shown as follows.
